We worked on our numbers 1-10 and counting buttons on the snowmen. The kids are doing well at recognizing their numbers and putting them in order. Their one to one is doing great!


We made snowmen with our names. Some are 'sooooo big' as the kids say. We are practicing writing our names and knowing what letters are in them.
