

We explored the primary colors. I love watching the colors the kids make with just those 3 colors. They get so excited and then it becomes a game to guess what color they will make.



### Curious Kinders News

We began this week with our Good Shepherd, Jesus, telling the story of "The Lost Sheep." Such a great way to remember how much our Heavenly Father loves us! For math, we reviewed place value and began learning how to measure things with a ruler. We used paper clip chains at first and the kids got to get things from the classroom to measure. We began reading from the yellow readers this week and continued reviewing "Meet the Sight Words 3". We spent a bit of time learning about penguins. The kids like that there is a penguin as tall as they are, and their other favorite is the smallest that only grows to be about 13 inches tall. God is so good in the ways He creates variety!



### Mrs. Davidson's Classroom

Another week has flown by and now February is nearly over! This week in Bible we read the story of Hannah, Samuel, and Eli and how Samuel was prayed for and was dedicated to God, then how God spoke to him when he was still young. We are focusing our attention on talking to God and listening for His voice in our lives - not usually audibly as Samuel heard, but in our minds, through His Word, and sometimes through the experience of others.

The first graders are learning to identify the long vowel sounds in words that end with a silent e. Second grade are learning the rules for adding -er and -est to the ends of words. In PE we worked on more hockey skills, this week focusing on shooting and defense. We finished our world geography unit on Asia this week, ending with a chance to try some Asian foods. Most of the kids tried something new!

Next week is Spirit Week and flyers went home telling what the theme is each day. This is always a fun week for the kids and we encourage everyone to participate. Have a great weekend!

### Mrs. Messecar's Classroom

In Bible this week we are learning that no matter what trials we face we can rest assured that God is going through them with us (He doesn't always take us out of them) and giving us the strength to accomplish what we need to. We read about Ernest Shackleton who led 27 explorers to Antarctica and their trials.

They never lost faith in God and survived very trying circumstances.

In math we are working very hard to accomplish the goals we set for ourselves.

Reading has been about volcanoes, especially Mt. St. Helens. We found it interesting that life continued to exist even in the upheaval. There were many animals and bugs who burrowed underground that survived.

We also learned about the Ring of Fire.

The 4th grade class is learning that when we keep our rivers and streams clean of contamination, the salmon can come back and survive. A group of elementary students in Everett, Washington cleaned the creek that was beside their school, got an aquarium and filled it with Coho eyed salmon eggs and raised them until they could be released into the creek. They had to wait for 3 years for them to return. They were thrilled.

In social studies we are learning the causes of WWI. We are seeing the interesting events that led up to it and how it relates to what is happening in Europe currently.
